I am not a numerologist, nor have I ever played one on TV. And truth be known, I don't place much stock in counting numbers to show how we should live. However, sometimes numbers can show us some very interesting things. What follows was sent to me a number of years ago, and I present it to you for your consideration.

The shortest chapter in the Bible is Psalm 117. So, what is the longest chapter? It's Psalm 119. Can you guess what happens to be the very center of the Bible? If you guessed Psalm 118, you would be correct. That is, on its own an amazing fact. However, we aren't done.

If you care to count, there are 594 chapters from Genesis 1 to Psalm 118, and guess what? There are exactly 594 chapters after Psalm 118 to Revelation 22. That is also an amazing fact. Sorry, but we aren't quite done yet. If you add together the total numbers of chapters before, and after, you get the number 1188. Hum, could that be a verse from Chapter 118, the very center of the Bible? And, can there be some grand significance in what verse 8 may tell us?
