I love going to the grocery store. Often, I go for one or two items and return with multiple bags. Here in lies the problem. Wanting to get out quickly, I often will just say, "I'll carry them out myself." I could use a cart, let someone wheel them out for me, or even drive up and have them put in the back of my car. But Nooo! I can do it myself. 8 bags per hand and out I go. Thank goodness for automatic doors. As I get close, a sensor responds to my motion and the doors slide open. Whew!

Note the word motion. To get the store's doors to open, you need to start moving in that direction. When you want God to open a door, you need to start moving toward it before it will open.

An example of what I mean is found in the book of Joshua, chapter 3. The Jewish nation is ready to move into the Promised Land. The first step of this journey is to cross the Jordan River. The problem is that the river is at flood stage. It is very deep and running extremely fast. The priests are to lead the way, but there are no bridges, boats, nothing to help them. Starting at verse 8, God instructs them to pick up The Ark of The Covenant, go to the river and when you reach the edge, to "go and

stand in it.” What!? You want me to do what?! If I was one of the priests, I think I would have said, “Why don’t you part the river like you parted the Red Sea? Then I’ll step in.” But note, God said “Step into the water and I will then part it so you can cross.” The priests did as they were told, and as soon as they touched the water, the river parted and the whole nation crossed over, as promised.

Notice, God wants them to do something before He acts. It’s always the same. Jesus changed water to wine, but the servants needed to bring jars of water. To feed 5,000, the disciples needed to bring Him what they could find and then organize the crowd. Jesus then fed them. Even to raise Lazarus, Jesus had someone roll away the stone first. There always needs to be some action, some motion from us; beginning with prayer. In other words, God responds to our faith, our trust, our belief, and our obedience. (Obedience to God being the key word.)

Is there something in your life where the door seems to be closed between you and God, and what He wants you to do? Have you been waiting for something to happen, something to begin? Maybe God is waiting for you to start walking in the direction of where you believe He wants you to go, even if there is a closed door or a flooded river in front of you. Our great God will take care of the obstacles; we just need to get moving in the direction He is leading.

As for my predicament; if I can now just figure out how to get my car door open without putting down all my groceries in the parking lot!
