In my 30 plus years as a salesman, I clocked some 2 million miles by car. During those trips there was plenty of time to think, plan, and to reminisce. Reminisce, means to look back. We can't totally forget our good or bad memories, but God tells us to "Not dwell on them." Our adversary, the evil one, is happiest when we look back, live in the past, dwell on things that cannot be changed.

Because by dwelling in the past, we forget about God, we miss His “New thing,” and become filled with despair and live with no hope.

So, what’s the answer? We are to keep driving forward. Yeah, you can check the rearview mirror from time to time, but if you only look back, you will eventually crash. And as for the unclaimed luggage; leave it on the carrousel. Let it only be a distant memory, because “Look! God is doing a new thing,” just for you.
