I felt a little bad about switching scriptures last Sunday, so I thought I would say a few words about Romans 6.

We are about to celebrate the 4th of July. Question: does Canada have a 4th of July? ...hmmm... Of course they do. Every country has a 4th of July. We happen to celebrate our independence on the 4th of July. I know I know, boo Rich, bad joke.

When we gained our independence from England, we received freedom. We became free to establish our own rules and government, and no king, country, or peoples can control us. That is freedom.

The Bible also talks about freedom, true freedom. A freedom that no one can ever take from you. But first we need to understand who we are. In Galatians 3, we are told, that we "are born prisoners to sin" and because of that, we need to be set free. But how? We are either slaves to sin, or slaves to righteousness (doing the right things), which means we either follow the world, or follow Jesus.

Romans 6:16 states, "the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life." So, we need to have a personal Independence Day, a day when we reject sin and the battle for freedom is won. But it's nothing we can do. Jesus fought the battle for us. He died in our place to pay the debt we owe to God. And by His doing so, "You have been set free from sin. God has made you His slaves. The benefit you gain leads to holy living, and the result is eternal life." Romans 6: 22-23.

Being set free from the control of sin is true independence. To "know the truth will set you free," and "if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." John 8:32,36.

So this Independence Day, when you are grilling burgers and watching fireworks, remember to celebrate not only our national freedoms, but also our eternal freedoms paid for by our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ.
